Course consists of three modules: *Firefighter Survival, Firefighter Rescue, RIT Operations*. The program, and associated curriculum, **exceeds** all aspects as outlined in NFPA 1407: Standard for Training Rapid Intervention Crews

• THIS IS A PHYSICALLY AND MENTALLY DEMANDING CLASS

- Student MUST participate in ALL practical activities AND score 80% minimum on the written test to successfully pass
- Students must be able to keep pace with the schedule
- Students must bring complete set of firefighter PPE including SCBA with three spare bottles (per student)
 (Gear does not need to be NFPA compliant and may be damaged during training)
